Principal's Report

Quality Work

Throughout the term identified students participated in the gifted and talented Project Based Learning (PBL) programs with Mr Peter Davis, who kindly volunteered his services to the school. Some Stage 3 students worked on a project related to improvement of the school sandpit while others engaged in classes to support exam techniques for selective high school placement tests. Some Stage 2 students worked on a project with an environmental theme and investigated the school recycling processes, while others worked mathematically on algebra, trigonometry and calculus. Stage 1 students collaboratively worked on a project to improve the Peace Garden area and came up with some solutions that Mr Shotton, our GA will be able to work on over the Christmas holiday period. Students took pleasure in applying their new found PBL skills to school identified problems and reported great satisfaction in using the 4Cs of Education; communication collaboration, critical thinking, and creativity, to solve real life problems and take their learning beyond the classroom. It was a pleasure to sit with students this week as they share their PBL experiences and we hope the school can act on some of their suggested solutions.

Students in 5/6B have enjoyed Creative Art lessons and this term have developed their pottery skills as they created ceramic sculptures including pinched pots, coil pots and Christmas ornaments. I was able to admire their handy work when the delicate pieces were still hot from the kiln. Beautiful work, 5/6B!

The Reading Recovery program is a researchbased early literacy program which aims to accelerate student progress of Year 1 students, to the average level of the grade as quickly as possible so students obtain maximum benefit from classroom instruction. This is achieved by trained Reading Recovery teachers who provide intensive one to one teaching for 30mins each day for an average period of 12 to 20 weeks to students who are experiencing difficulty with reading. Well done Mrs Thompson, you have made a difference to the Yr 1 students at Kahibah PS!

The New Way

There will be changes in route services which may affect students

Newcastle Transport announced the new network last week, with more than a thousand extra bus and ferry services to be delivered when the new network is implemented on 14 January 2018.

The new network will improve bus connections between major hubs and the Newcastle CBD offering services every 15 minutes during the day, and will also strengthen links between suburbs and town centers.

Most of the bus routes have been revised and new bus routes have been added to the network to better meet customer needs. To match the new network, we have simplified the route numbers to double digits.

There are no changes to dedicated school services.

School students who use regular routes will need to check their route to and from school. Our Travel Concierge can be contacted at newcastletransport.info to provide assistance to parents and students in understanding the changes and planning their new trip.

There are a number of ways customers and the community can access information, including:

- At newcastletransport.info where you can view an interactive map of the network, download the new map and read about key timetable and route changes by area.
- Our Travel Concierge will provide assistance to customers to understand the changes and plan their new trip.
- The Newcastle Transport Hub at 152 Hunter Street, Newcastle, where the community can talk to the Newcastle Transport team face to face and provide feedback. The Hub is open Monday to Friday, between 8am and 5pm and between Saturdays 9am and 5pm.
- The Newcastle Transport Facebook page.
- Our customer service team will be out and about on the network and in local shopping centres. A calendar of locations will be available on the Newcastle Transport website.
